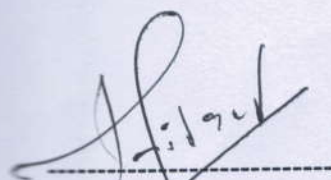

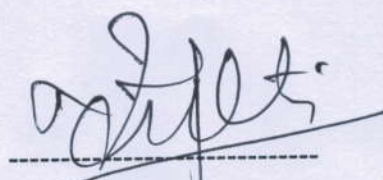

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Education Management Information System (EMIS) Report of Higher Education 2025/2026 A.D. (2082/83 B.S.) presents the academic and administrative status of People's Campus, Kathmandu. As a constituent campus of Tribhuvan University, People's Campus is committed to providing quality higher education and developing competent graduates through its undergraduate and postgraduate programs under the Faculty of Management.

The report has been prepared using both primary and secondary sources of information collected from various academic and administrative units of the campus. The information was compiled, verified, and analyzed in accordance with the guidelines and indicators prescribed by the Education Management Information System (EMIS). The report serves as an important reference for institutional planning, policy formulation, monitoring, transparency, and continuous quality enhancement.

During the academic year 2082/83 B.S., a total of 615 students were enrolled at People's Campus. Of these, 282 students (45.85%) were male and 333 students (54.15%) were female, indicating greater participation of female students in higher education programs at the campus. The Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS) program had the highest enrollment with 281 students, followed by Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) with 176 students, Bachelor of Business Management (BBM) with 84 students, and Master of Business Studies (MBS) with 74 students.

The enrollment pattern demonstrates the growing popularity of management education and reflects the campus's continued contribution to expanding access to higher education. Overall, the findings indicate that People's Campus maintains a strong academic presence, with increasing female participation and sustained demand for its management programs, thereby supporting the development of skilled human resources for Nepal's socio-economic progress.

During the preparation of this report, some data could not be retrieved from the Mitra ERP v3 System due to technical issues. Therefore, the report has been prepared based on the data available and accessible during the reporting period. Efforts are being made to address the technical limitations and improve data retrieval processes. People's Campus is a higher education institution operating under Tribhuvan University. The campus provides academic programs at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

The campus mainly runs programs under the Faculty of Management. The academic programs offered by the campus include

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA),

Master of Business Studies (MBS).

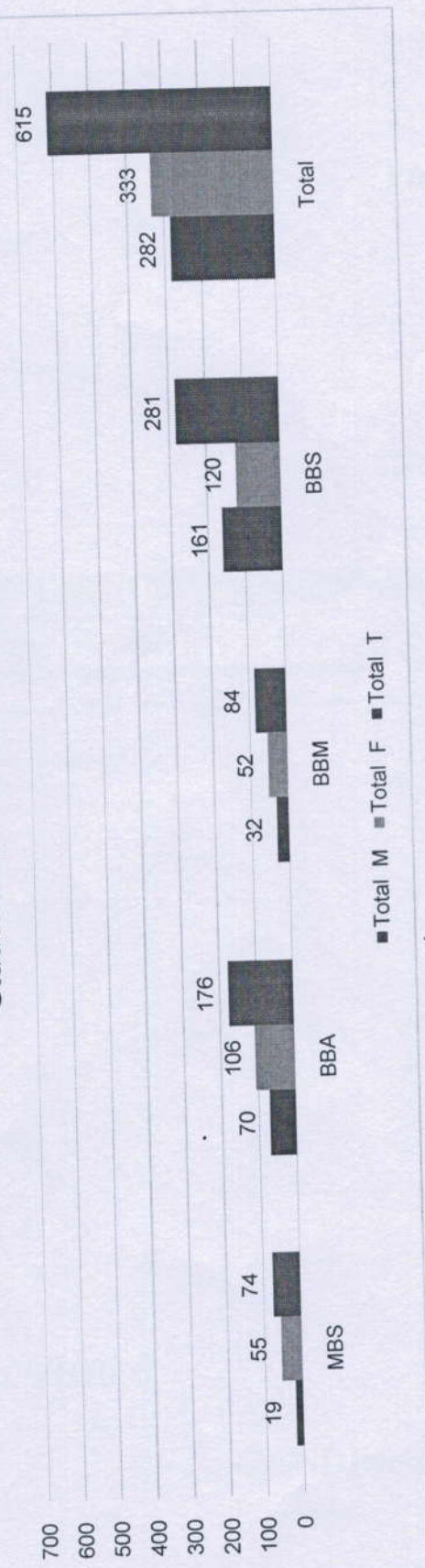


Figure 1 Student Enrollment in different faculty and gender

The student enrollment data of People's Campus for the academic year 2082/83 shows that a total of **615 students** were enrolled in different academic programs. Among them, **282 were male students** and **333 were female students**, indicating higher participation of female students in the campus.

At the master's level, the **MBS program** enrolled a total of **74 students**, including **19 male** and **55 female** students. Female enrollment was significantly higher than male enrollment in this program.

At the bachelor's level, the **BBS program** had the highest enrollment with **281 students**, comprising **161 male** and **120 female** students. Similarly, the **BBA program** enrolled **176 students**, including **70 male** and **106 female** students, while the **BBM program** had **84 students**, with **32 male** and **52 female** students.

Semester-wise analysis shows that student enrollment was concentrated mainly in the first, third, fifth, and seventh semesters, whereas no enrollment data were recorded in the second, fourth, sixth, and eighth semesters during the reporting period. Overall, the data indicate that the Faculty of Management continues to attract a considerable number of students, with female students representing a larger proportion of total enrollment in most programs.

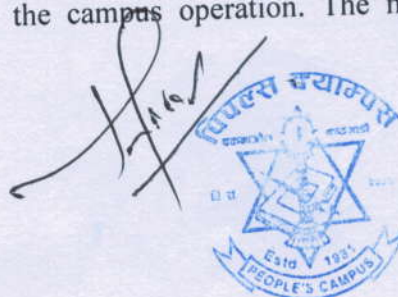
